East Boldre Parish Council in-person meetings COVID-safety arrangements

On 21 February 2022, the prime minister announced that the government will be removing remaining domestic restrictions in England. The government guidance can be found at: <https://www.gov.uk/coronavirus>, including the plan for living with COVID-19. From 24 February 2022, people will not be legally required to self-isolate if they test positive for COVID-19. The advice in the guidance is to stay at home if you can and avoid contact with other people.

In order to decrease the risk of catching and passing on COVID-19, the government advises people to get vaccinated. It also advises letting fresh air in if meeting inside, or meeting outside and to consider wearing a face-covering in crowded and enclosed spaces, It says to try to stay at home if unwell and to take a test if you have COVID-19 symptoms.
