East Boldre Parish Council guidance - anti-social and criminal behaviour

Updated March 2024

The vast majority of people in the parish of East Boldre are caring, considerate and responsible. There is a community spirit which we are proud of. However, in recent years there have been some reports of inappropriate behaviour caused by a minority of people, both from our own parish and from outside.

We know that anti-social behavior adversely impacts on the quality of lives of all people within our community. Examples of such behavior are:

- Inappropriate use of vehicles and loud excessive engine noise.
- Nuisance, rowdy or inconsiderate neighbours.
- Begging and vagrancy.
- Street drinking
- Environmental damage including littering, dumping of rubbish (fly tipping) and abandonment of cars.
- Vandalism, graffiti and fly posting.
- Fireworks misuse.

Please be aware that young people gathering in groups does not necessarily constitute anti-social behaviour; and may actually signify another underlying issue.

Criminal behaviour is a form of anti-social behaviour. It includes:

- Property related crime including physical damage, theft and fraud.
- Violent crime including physical assault and robbery.

We want to encourage residents to work collaboratively. It is very important that we report our concerns regarding criminal activity or anti-social behaviour. The following procedures apply:

Crime

- Where you or your property are at immediate risk of harm ring Hampshire Constabulary on 999.
- Alternatively, if the perpetrator is not present, and you or your property are not at immediate risk of harm contact Hampshire Constabulary on 101 or online at www.hampshire.police.uk
